1. READ YOUR BOOK.

Read your project book starting with the Member's Project Guide pages. You should understand all of the information in the book. If there is something you don't understand, ask an advisor or parent.

2. DO ALL THE ACTIVITIES IN YOUR BOOK.

Neatly complete your book by following the instructions the book gives you. Do all the activities listed under the Project Guidelines listed in the front of your project book.

3. ATTEND 4-H PROJECT JUDGING DAY

If you wish to compete for county project awards and be eligible for state fair competition, you will need to attend 4-H Project Judging Day. The Judge will be looking for the seven clues to fashion, will look at your project and ask you questions about things you have learned.

4. EXHIBIT YOUR PROJECT AT THE MORGAN COUNTY FAIR.

Your club may choose to have a booth at the fair in which you will exhibit your project. Your club may also decide to include your project book as part of the exhibit. Be sure to ask your advisor about your club booth. Booths must be in place by 12:00 noon Monday of the Morgan County Fair.

**You will receive a fair pass and premium money for your project if you have your project judged; receive an A, B, or C grade from your advisor; and have your project exhibited at the fair.**
