Judging day is Wednesday, July 7 @ Fairgrounds

1. READ YOUR BOOK AND DO THE ACTIVITIES IN YOUR BOOK -- Read your project book starting with the Member's Project Guide pages. Ask an advisor or parent if you need help understanding your book. Neatly complete your book by following the instructions the book gives you. Fill in all the blanks and do the activities it asks you to do.
2. MAKE A DISPLAY ABOUT SOMETHING YOU LEARNED FROM YOUR PROJECT FOR COUNTY JUDGING -- Make a display to show something you learned from the activities you did in the project.
3. ATTEND 4-H PROJECT JUDGING DAY -- If you wish to compete for county project awards and be eligible for state fair competition, you will need to attend 4-H Project Judging Day, where you will be interviewed by a judge who will ask you questions about things you have learned. You may also be asked to demonstrate your knowledge and skills in your project area.
4. EXHIBIT YOUR PROJECT AT THE MORGAN COUNTY FAIR -- Your club may choose to have a booth at the fair in which you will exhibit your project. Your club may also decide to include your project book as part of the exhibit. Be sure to ask your advisor about your club booth. Booths must be in place by 12:00 noon Monday of the Morgan County Fair. **You will receive a fair pass and premium money for your project if you have your project judged; receive an A, B, or C grade from your advisor; and have your project exhibited at the fair.**
